Camping/Caravanning/Motorcaravanning

Water damage in your caravan can cost you dear

Damage from moisture or water infiltration can be very costly.

Damp is often self-inflicted because if one does not regularly reduce humidity by airing thoroughly or by using a dehumidifier, there is the risk of mildew and consequent damage to furnishings. It makes no difference whether the vehicle is new or second-hand. It is always the camper who has to bear the repair costs.

If you do have water infiltration, it is important to have a guarantee and to have carried out annual watertightness tests. Many manufacturers offer guarantees of up to 12 years. This ensures that the purchaser can recover damages from the vehicle manufacturer for subsequent leaks after 5 or 6 years (depends on the manufacturer) but only if watertightness tests have been undertaken regularly and within the required time limits.

Long-term campers especially should think about how and where annual watertightness tests are carried out on their caravans/motorcaravans.

Not included in the watertightness guarantee (at least in Germany) is damage from leaking water tanks or pipes.

Also in the case of older vehicles (guarantee expired), one should not stop regular checks of potential leaky areas, i.e. roof windows, doors and flaps.

Moisture meters can be a very useful backup but the “do it yourself“ principle is quite tricky and there is a lot to learn.

Driving your outfit when tired is really dangerous

The first signs of tiredness are frequent yawning, lack of concentration or even drooping eyelids. This is when you start to put yourself as well as others in danger. Anyone who nods off for just one second when driving at 120 km/h for example, will be flying blind for 33 metres. If it is for three seconds then the distance is 100 metres. For all this time no-one is in control of a vehicle, outfit or motorcaravan on the move.

It's time to take a break and have a 15 to 20 minute nap at least, after which it's better to walk around in the fresh air for a while rather than resorting to a power coffee or energy drink.

Also it's a good idea to avoid eating big meals or fatty food – a full stomach makes you sleepy. So make sure you opt for light food and mineral water or diluted fruit juice are the best drinks.

After two hours at the wheel it is time to take a break even if you still feel reasonably alert – that is the general rule.

For some time now many vehicle manufacturers have been installing a warning system against fatigue as a technical solution to help prevent drivers from nodding off at the wheel. Installing this system has been mandatory in all new vehicles in the EU since July 2024.

Germany: Caravanning tourism: Record figures for overnight stays and revenue – new cooperation strengthens development in national nature reserves

Mobile holidays are more popular than ever: overnight stays and tourist revenue in caravanning tourism at record levels. Associations promote sustainable and climate-friendly caravanning tourism in National Nature Reserves with new cooperation.

The continuing trend towards individual and flexible holidays with caravans or motorcaravans is strengthening domestic tourism and the German economy: in 2023, overnight stays reached a historic high and tourism turnover climbed to a record level of around 19.5 billion euros.

The Association of Deutscher Naturparke e.V. (VDN), Nationale Naturlandschaften e.V. (NNL) and the Caravanning Industrie Verband e.V. (CIVD) have therefore launched a partnership. The aim is to jointly promote and steer sustainable and environmentally friendly caravanning tourism in Germany's most beautiful nature reserves.

In 2023, overnight stays at campsites and motor caravan sites in Germany reached a new record level. According to a study by the German Economic Institute for Tourism (dwif), a total of 54.5 million overnight stays were registered on campsites and 13.5 million overnight stays on motor caravan sites - clear evidence of the continuing trend towards caravanning holidays. This growing popularity is also reflected in the economic development: caravanning holidaymakers generated a record tourism revenue of around 19.5 billion euros in 2023, an increase of almost 8 per cent compared to the previous year (2022: 18.1 billion euros). Around 6.4 billion euros of this revenue will remain directly in the holiday regions and strengthen the local economy: not only operators of campsites and pitches benefit from the long-term caravanning trend, but also local companies, shops and service providers. Caravanning tourism therefore makes a significant contribution to value creation in the regions and emphasises its importance for the German economy.

CIVD Managing Director Daniel Onggowinarso explains how this development is influencing the destinations in Germany: 'Germany is becoming an increasingly attractive travel destination for caravanning holidaymakers, especially in areas beyond the classic tourist hubs. For these travellers, the focus is increasingly on experiencing nature and sustainability, both in everyday life and on holiday. Caravanning therefore offers local communities excellent opportunities for tourism development and sustainable regional economic value. With relatively little investment, they can create an attractive infrastructure and attract new guests'.

Associations promote sustainable and climate-friendly caravanning tourism

In light of caravanning holidaymakers' great affinity with nature, the National Nature Reserves - consisting of 104 nature parks, 16 national parks, 18 biosphere reserves and three wilderness areas, which together cover a third of Germany's surface area - are popular destinations for guests from Germany and abroad.

The cross-association cooperation between Deutscher Naturparke e.V. (VDN), Nationale Naturlandschaften e.V. (NNL) and Caravanning Industrie Verband e.V. (CIVD) aims, among other things, to further develop the range of park and accommodation options in such a way that biodiversity is preserved, unique nature experiences are made possible and regional, sustainable value creation is strengthened. Innovative site concepts should not only meet the needs of travellers, but also promote awareness of environmental protection, nature conservation and sustainable development through nature-friendly experiences.

In the long term, the cooperation partners are aiming to create an attractive and sustainable caravanning infrastructure that informs and guides mobile travellers using digital technologies. As part of the cooperation, the associations are supporting several nationwide pilot projects in the National Nature Reserves. The aim is to test and further develop practical solutions and concepts and then implement them in other regions. Jan Wildefeld, Managing Director of Nationale



Naturlandschaften e. V., emphasises the joint benefits of the newly created cooperation: 'Our vision is to design caravanning in Germany's most beautiful nature reserves in such a way that it is in harmony with nature conservation and regional development. Together we are creating a win-win situation: travellers enjoy unique nature experiences with modern infrastructure, while innovative pitch concepts preserve and protect nature. At the same time, we are raising awareness among holidaymakers of the value of our nature and the importance of preserving it. In this way, we combine environmentally conscious tourism with regional economic benefits and a responsible approach to nature.'

Practical tips – useful for campers too

In order to sharpen a pair of **scissors** quickly, take a strip of aluminium foil, fold it over five or six times and cut it up into small pieces. Just make sure you use the entire length of the blades!

Stubborn tea stains can be removed by making a paste of baking powder mixed with a little water. Spread the paste on the stain, leave for a few minutes and then machine wash.

Mandatory motorway vignette exemptions in Austria:

The following motorway stretches in Austria are toll-free

- Tirol: Inntal autobahn A12 between the national border at Kufstein and the Kufstein-Süd junction
- Salzburg province: West autobahn A1 between the national border at Walsertal and the Salzburg-Nord junction
- Vorarlberg: Rheintal/Walgau autobahn A14 between the national border at Hörbranz and the Hohenems junction

N.B. If you continue further without a vignette, you can expect a hefty fine.

“We were confronted with the pleasant problem as to how we could be fair towards these outstanding campsites. So we came up with a new award: the DCC Europa Platinum Award“, DCC President Dieter Albert explained.

This Award was granted for the first time at Reise+Camping in 2014. The DCC President explained that “In order to respect the special status of these campsites, only two are honoured every year from among the ranks of previous DCC Europa prize-winners, the very best so-to-speak. A prerequisite for receiving this prize is that the high standard that led to the DCC Europa Prize has been maintained for at least 10 years and even improved on.

This year exhibitors from 20 countries participated in the biggest holiday fair in Germany's Nordrhein-Westfalia region. This event is an important platform for advertising and presenting new trends in the camping industry.
